

**CITY OF LAGRANGE, GEORGIA**  
**WATER AND SEWER CONNECTION FEES**  
**Effective 08-27-2019**

The fees for connecting to the City’s water and sewer system shall be as follows for all building permits issued after August 27, 2019:

- Sewer capacity fees are collected when a building permit is issued. Water capacity fees are included on the first utility bill after the meter is installed with the exception of multi-family projects where the fee is also collected when the building permit is issued.
- Three quarter inch (¾”) meters installed by the City include a backflow prevention device. For meters larger than ¾” and/or any meters serving irrigation systems, the customer will be responsible for the installation of a testable backflow device meeting the requirements of the City’s Backflow Prevention and Cross Connection Control Plan.
- Capacity Fees are applicable to all new service connections and existing service connections where the water or sewer capacity is increased. For water meters and sewer taps serving facilities with multiple occupancies or living units, the Capacity Fees shall be multiplied by the number of individual occupancies or living units.
- For redevelopment projects located on property that has received prior water or sewer service of equal or greater capacity, the Capacity Fees shall be multiplied by twenty five percent (25%).
- For meter installations requiring the extension of a water main or deemed by the City to be more costly than a normal installation, customers will be required to pay a Contribution in Aid of Construction Fee as determined by the City in order to ensure proper amortization of the additional construction cost.
- The City maintains water taps from the water main to the outlet of the meter box. The City maintains sewer taps from the sewer main to the street right-of-way boundary. Water service lines and backflow devices located downstream of the meter box and sewer service lines beyond the right-of-way boundary are the maintenance responsibility of the property owner.
- Water and sewer installations shall comply with City specifications and must be inspected prior to being placed into service.
